Who This Resource is For: This physician resource focuses on unique palliative care needs of people experiencing homelessness during the COVID-19 pandemic. It is intended to be a living document that may be periodically updated as the COVID-19 pandemic evolves, and the needs of physicians and the patients they care for change.

Introduction to Palliative Care: Palliative care is a human right. It is a team approach to caring for clients facing lifelimiting illnesses (i.e. illness that will foreseeably result in death). Palliative care includes, but is not limited to, end-of-life care. A palliative approach focuses on quality of life for clients and the people who matter to them. This approach affirms life and understands death as part of each person's journey. Palliative care provides holistic care through:

- Relief of symptoms (e.g. pain, shortness of breath)
- Helping to put extra supports in place
- Understanding, and attending to, what matters to the client (wishes, expectations, values)
